## 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual BCGS All Breed Obedience & Rally Trial Dec 8, 2018 Chuckanut Farm Bow WA.

This was the 2<sup>nd</sup> year BCGS has hosted this event the 2<sup>nd</sup> Saturday in December at Chuckanut Farm training facility in Bow. To hold both events in one day with one judge, we must stay within an 8-hour mandated event time, and we were only a few entries shy of maxing out. We will need to limit entries at these events in 2019.



Judge Earl Vaughn judged 46 Obedience entries between 8:00 AM and 1:15PM.

We had representation in every offered class, Utility A & B, Open A & B and Novice A & B. High in Trail was earned by Rosemary Jorgenson with "Telyn's Enjoying Everyday Life" a Shetland Sheepdog with a score of 194 from the Novice B class. Rosmary also earned High Combined with another Shetland Sheepdog "Bluevalley Astronomical Legacy UD" with scores of 198 in Open B and 188 out of Utility B class.

At 2:00 PM rally commenced with 50 entries and again representation in almost every offered class. Master, Excellent A & B, Advanced A & B, Intermediate and Novice A & B. High Combined was earned by Anglea Giddings with her Australian Shepard "Echeleon"s Raise a Ruckus at Altain BN RA FDC" with combined scores of 93 (Excellent B) and 98 (Advanced B) class.

Bulldogs owned by BCGS member Cheryl Knapp were well represented winning 1<sup>st</sup> 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place in Rally Masters class. As for obedience, Cheryl's says... "sooo close today for all three girls in their difficult Advanced Obedience Classes" .... I do have to say that I was very impressed with each of her entries watching the Silttingbullies gang do their stuff!



BCGS worked very hard @20 years ago to gain their obedience credentials to hold Obedience and then Rally events and have historically chosen to hold them as the first event of our specialty shows. It is important to hold an annual performance event to maintain this ability. With limited entries from bulldogs, BCGS had toyed with inviting All Breeds to our events and tried this successfully at Argus Ranch 4 years ago simultaneous to the Conformation show in a 2<sup>nd</sup> ring. The year after hosting Nationals, BCGS searched for a location and date to begin a standalone event.



This early December date has been well received by Northwestern WA Performance Community.



As we as a club strive to fundraise and support all club activities, this has become a nice single day event where 4-5 club members can volunteer and make @\$1000 in profit. We as bulldoggers are providing a service to the performance community.



I would like to specifically thanks 4 Bulldoggers, Winn Ryman and Vicky Langager buying and making boxed lunches for the participants to purchase as well as joining Melanie Trichler. as very effective ring stewards. For anyone that has not been to view Obedience and Rally, the stewards are a critical part of each event, supporting the judge in the setting up of the ring and performing a variety of duties for him during the event.



Lastly our Ultimate Performance Bulldogger Cheryl Knapp who first found this venue and has continued to coordinate Jan's training facility and has continued promoted this event throughout the year to all her whole performance family in the Northwest.

Everyone pitched in setting up the ring areas, guiding a busy load and unload area for very tight parking and breaking down at the end of a long day.



Planning is already underway to hold the 3<sup>rd</sup> annual event on Dec 7<sup>th</sup>, 2019 at Chuckanut Farm in Bow WA...... Judge **Don Rennick** of Lake Stevens has accepted our invitation to be our Judge. ## 'Tis the Season for PET SAFETY TIPS!

#### **COOKIES AND CANDY**

Consumption of chocolate can cause agitation, vomiting, diarrhea, high heart rate, tremors, seizures and even death.

## MACADAMIA NUTS AND WALNUTS

These nuts can cause severe lethargy, increased body temperature, vomiting, tremors, joint stiffness and the inability to walk.

#### HOLIDAY DECORATIONS

Tinsel, ribbon and similar decorations can cut up the digestive tract and cause intestinal obstruction. Ornaments should be kept off low-lying Christmas tree branches.

#### LIGHTS AND CANDLES

If your pet can reach them, they may be a fire hazard if knocked over.

#### **ALCOHOL**

Alcoholic drinks may cause vomiting, disorientation, diarrhea, lethargy, lack of coordination, difficulty breathing, tremors, coma and seizures.

#### GRAPES, RAISINS, AVOCADOS, ONIONS AND GARLIC

These can cause lethargy, lack of appetite and vomiting.

## ARTIFICIAL SWEETENERS

Sugarless gum and artificially sweetened treats may cause vomiting, lethargy, loss of coordination, seizures and liver failure.

## FATTY TRIMMINGS AND BONES

Pets may experience vomiting and diarrhea. Fatty foods can also promote pancreatitis. Swallowed bones can cause stomach perforation and painful constipation.

#### **HOLIDAY PLANTS**

Holly, mistletoe and poinsettias may cause irritation, vomiting, diarrhea and heart arrhythmia in both cats and dogs.

#### **ELECTRICAL CORDS**

If chewed, live electrical cords can cause burns in or around a pet's mouth, difficulty breathing, seizures and cardiac arrest.


